Young union members between the ages of 19 – 30 are invited to meet other young activist and learn about the labour movement and where they fit in.

If you are interested in learning about the labour movement or are just wanting to meet other young union members this is the place to be.

The Conference will be taking place at Camp Jubilee which is nestled in the mountains and in the Indian Arm. There will be a number of activities and workshops over the three days.

Conference participants will be sharing cabins, and you will be required to bring a number of things:

- Sleeping Bag
- Pillow
- Ear plugs – you will be sharing a cabin with up to 9 others
- If you do not want to share a cabin, you can bring a tent
- Towels
- Extra shoes
- Rain gear
- Flashlight
- Personal toiletries
- Food will be provided, but if you would like other food and beverage for your personal use, you will have to bring that as well.
- If you play an instrument, bring it as we will be having a talent display on Saturday night!

Check in will be at 2:00 pm at the Government Dock in Deep Cove. If you are coming in from out of town, you may need to arrange with other young workers from your union to pick you up and take you there. You may want to check out the Gen-U Facebook page to connect with people who are also going.

Since you will be camping, you may want to bring extra clothes and nothing too fancy.

The cost of the conference is \$215 and will cover accommodation, meals and conference fee.

WORKSHOP OPTIONS

1. Getting Your Message Out



This workshop will assist you in representing young workers and their issues by giving you skills to speak up and speak out. Participants will learn how to write and deliver speeches on the fly and the basics of working with the media and developing a message for campaigns.

2. Mobilizing Young Workers



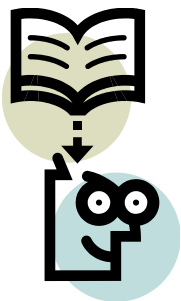
Young workers are a hard demographic to identify and activate. This workshop will look at different ways of getting young people involved in the union and in the workplace. Participants will examine some of the successes that different unions and organizations have had and will learn how to start and maintain young worker committees, plan actions and organize social events.

3. Introduction to the Labour Movement



This workshop is for those people who are members of unions but are not quite sure what that means. You will learn about the labour structure, laws, history as well as opportunities for involvement.

4. Facilitating Skills



If you are interested in delivering and developing workshops and educating your fellow union members and young workers, this is the workshop for you. This workshop will cover the principles of union education and how to motivate members.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

As the name states, this is a camp, and it is not some fancy resort.

There are set times to get the boat to the camp – if you miss it you will be left behind!

Meal times will be as follows:

- Breakfast 8:30 am
- Lunch 12:30 pm
- Dinner 6:00 pm on Friday and 5:30 pm on Saturday

There will be coffee, tea and fruit available between the meals.

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas.

If you bring snacks to the camp, please note that food and drinks are not permitted in your cabin, but there will be a place to store them at the camp.

Bathrooms are on a septic system – this means nothing can go in other than toilet paper. There will be garbage cans in the washrooms for other disposable items.

While it is understood that participants are all responsible adults, the consumption of alcohol will be limited to after workshops and evening sessions have adjourned.

You can also bring a tent and camp in a common camping area. If you would prefer to do this, please let us know so we do not assign you to a cabin.

Camp Jubilee has a nut free policy, so please do not bring anything that may contain nuts.

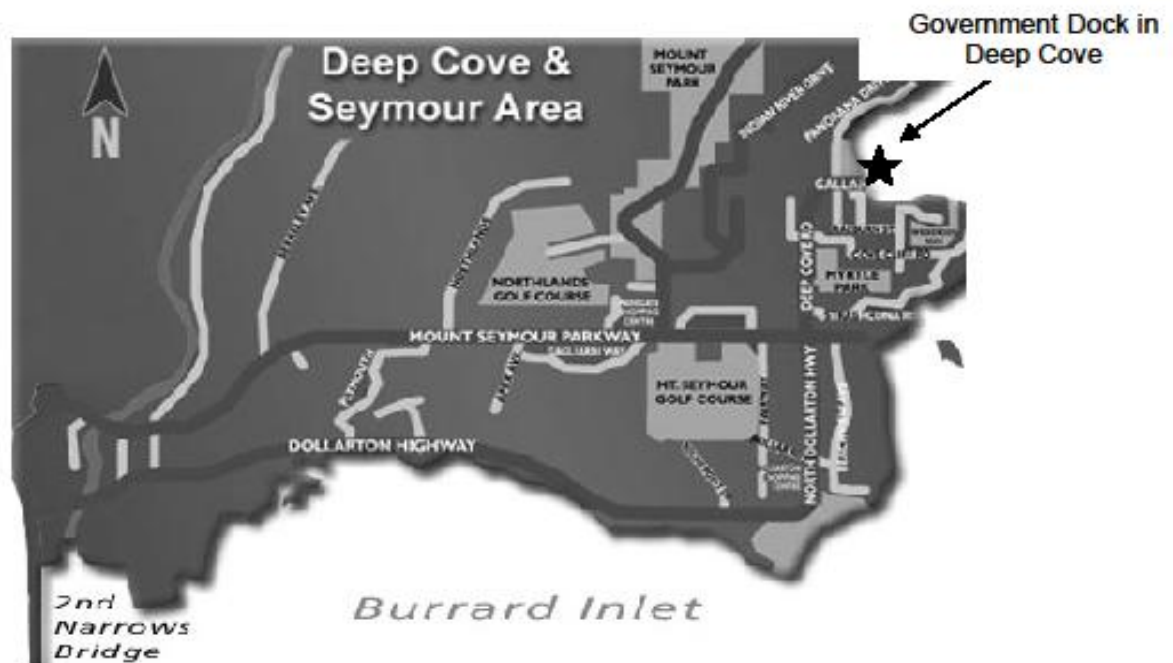

Directions to Deep Cove

- Go over the Second Narrows Bridge (Ironworkers Memorial Bridge).
- Take the first exit, Eastbound, off the bridge and onto the Dollarton Highway (if you end up on the Mount Seymour Parkway, don't worry, it goes the same way).
- Continue East until Dollarton Highway becomes Deep Cove Road and finally turns into Gallant Ave.
- The Government Dock is right between Deep Cove Canoe & Kayak and Panorama Park.
- Day parking is available at Panorama Park. If you are staying overnight, drop someone off at the dock with your luggage and drive a couple of blocks into the residential area to park. Please be aware of any posted parking signs.
